Suggestions Corner:

If you have any good ideas just let me know and I'll pass them along.

I noted that at the recent Oshkosh event that many RV's complained of damage to control surfaces caused by gusty winds, particularly the RV14's rudder assembly. As gust locks don't come with the kits we have to find or invent our own. I unashamedly stole all my ideas from other people so I thought I'd share them with you. I have an RV14 and I thought the rudder stops would prevent any damage, I was wrong, you would be surprised how far the rudder can flex and bend past the rudder stops and cause the rudder to hit the nearby elevators causing dents or at worst holes. Just ask this years Oshkosh team. So lets have a look at my gust locks;

Aileron Lock:



Four pieces of angle pop rivetted to a piece of flat. A small amount of non-slip rubber glued onto angle to prevent scratches and make it a firm fit. Very simple to manufacture




Slide it between the aileron and wingtip



Ailerons are now locked. It has never moved or slipped off in all kinds of winds.

Elevator Lock



Again, another four pieces of angle and a bigger piece of flat. The bottom two pieces of angle are pop rivetted in place. Again glue non slip rubber to the angle surfaces.



The top two angle pieces are removable and are secured by one machine screw and wing nut.




Slide or place the flat plate between the elevator and horizontal stabliser





Lock the two top pieces of angle together and the gust lock is secure

Rudder Lock:



Electrical conduit from Bunnings Aviation



Ends cut to fit over round tubing at bottom of rudder pedals



Install over rudder pedals and lock back onto vertical shelf associated with control stick. Note Velcro tape holding lock down and secure, otherwise conduit can walk upwards and free itself in gusty conditions



Velcro tape raps around my emergency exit (light weight) axe (Fiskars brand). Axe is also good for hammering ground stakes in and smashing canopy open in emergency. In my case I secure the Velcro around the axe handle and this holds the rudder gust lock down and firm.

Other Suggestions:



Hangar Rash: Pool Noodle fitted to wing tip, prevents wing tip damage when someone else moves your plane around in the hangar. Guess how I worked this one out?



Tyre inflation access point. Sick and tired of removing wheels spats to check tyre inflation? Go to Repco and buy the biggest rubber grommet on the shelf. Drill a hole for access to valve stem, remove valve cap with socket on extension and inflate the tyre. I check my tyres every three months and always have need to put about 6 psi in every time, tubes do not hold pressure forever



Whiteboard Scheduler:

This is my whiteboard with all my current reminders, I'd be lost without it.





Life jacket. This is an aviation lifejacket that straps around your waist and fits comfortably. When you need it you just pull up that orange flap and pull it over your head, easy to use and comfortable to wear. It has a ten year operational life before inspection, better than those boat inflatable life jackets that need inspecting every twelve months and are hot and uncomfortable to wear. \$165 from Sky Shop.
